Wounded Warriors get a lift

The task, at first, does not appear profoundly different for the Medical Motor Service (MMS) driver assigned to it. Safely transport six disabled clients and their guests from the Greater Rochester International Airport to a city location. At the airport, this mission becomes very different. A press conference welcomes the 2008 Wounded Warrior Disabled Sports Project to town. Six members of

the United States military services, who had experienced injuries in the war in Iraq, load into a MMS van and are moved swiftly in an escorted motorcade to the Genesee Waterways Center (GWC) to compete in the 12th Annual Rochester River Challenge Outrigger Canoe Sprint Races.

The Rochester River Challenge is an inclusive outrigger canoeist competition for paddlers with and without physical and/or intellectual disabilities that began in 1997 and is sponsored by a local non-profit organization founded by Jan Whitaker called Cape Ability Outrigger Ohana (Oh-hah-na is Hawaiian for family). An outrigger canoe is a type of canoe that features a lateral support float, called an outrigger, fastened to the hull for improved

stability. More than 300 outrigger canoeists formed seven-member teams that raced in two 400-meter sprints for fastest times. After competing, MMS transported the Wounded Warriors to a variety of locations throughout Rochester. "This is our fourth year with Jan Whitaker and the Cape Ability Outrigger Ohana. Our drivers line up to volunteer for this. These Wounded Warriors are so inspiring and great to spend time with that we just keep finding more ways to get involved," said Damon Mustaca, Director of Operations at MMS. "It is so rewarding to see the accomplishments these young men and women make after the sacrifices they have made," continued Damon "and to be told that Medical Motor Service has become part of the Ohana." ♥

2008 MS Public Policy Conference



On May 6, more than 400 MS activists from around the country met in Washington, DC for the 2008 MS Public Policy Conference. Craig

Crawford, a popular commentator who appears regularly on "The Early Show," was a keynote speaker.

Activists met with their legislators in the House and Senate, including members of the two Congressional MS Caucuses. The priority issues included:

- Increasing federal investment in MS research through funds made available by the Department of Defense.

- Eliminating the 24-month waiting period before Social Security Disability beneficiaries are entitled to medical coverage.
- Conducting accurate assessments of the incidence and prevalence of MS in the United States.

The Upstate New York Chapter of the National Multiple Sclerosis Society was represented at the conference by Randal Simonetti, President & CEO; Stephanie Mincer, LMSW, MSSMC, Vice President of Programs and Services; Courtney Totter, MSSMC, Manager of Advocacy Programs and Services, and chapter volunteers, Dr. Marla Eglowstein and Joseph Miller. ♥
